



# Top Manufacturing Careers\*



## CNC MACHINIST

A CNC Machinist operates computer-controlled machines or robots to perform one or more machine functions on metal or plastic work pieces.

## DRAFTERS

Drafters craft and prepare detailed working diagrams of machinery and mechanical devices, including dimensions, fastening methods, and other crucial engineering information.

## FIRST LINE SUPERVISORS OF MECHANICS, INSTALLERS, AND REPAIRERS

First Line Supervisors inspect and monitor work areas, examine tools and equipment, and provide employee safety training to prevent, detect, and correct unsafe conditions or violations of procedures and safety rules.

## INSPECTORS, TESTERS, SORTERS, SAMPLERS, AND WEIGHERS

Workers in these jobs inspect, test, or measure materials, products, installations, or work for conformance to specifications. They also measure dimensions of products to verify conformance to specifications, using measuring instruments such as rulers, calipers, gauges, or micrometers.

## MANUFACTURING ENGINEERS

Manufacturing Engineers design, integrate, or improve manufacturing systems or related processes. They may work with commercial or industrial designers to refine product designs to increase productivity and decrease costs.

## MANUFACTURING PRODUCTION TECHNICIANS

Manufacturing Production Technicians inspect finished products for quality and adherence to customer specifications. They also set up and operate production equipment in accordance with current good manufacturing practices and standard operating procedures.

## TEAM ASSEMBLERS

Team assemblers work as part of a team having responsibility for assembling an entire product or component of a product. They can perform all tasks conducted by the team in the assembly process and rotate through all or most of them rather than being assigned to a specific task on a permanent basis.

## WELDERS

Welders use hand-welding or flame-cutting equipment to weld or join metal components or to fill holes, indentations, or seams of fabricated metal products.
